

Hotel restaurants add a 10% service charge plus an additional 6% tourism fee, if you are pleased with the service then add 10% to the bill. By law service charges are not added to restaurants and cafés outside of hotels, leave a tip on the table or in the tip "box". Tipping elsewhere is at your discretion. Round up the bill for taxi drivers and Dhs10 for porters is appropriate.

Shopping hours

Daily from 10am to 10pm or later on weekends. Malls open right through but some independent shops can close from 1pm to 4pm in an extended lunch break.

Weather

Hot dry and quite humid, with temperatures in the summer months from June to September ranging from 35°C to 45°C. Any rain that falls is likely to be during January to

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Shopping hours

Generally hours are 9am to 1pm and 4pm to 9pm or later.

The Dubai Mall hours are Sunday to Wednesday 10 am to 10 pm. Thursday, Friday, Saturday 10am to 12 midnight.

Tipping

Government adds 10% service charge to restaurants, hotels and bars, but feel free to top it up with a few dirham. If there is no service charge add 10-15%. Porters should receive 10Dhs. Taxi drivers do not expect tips but it is good practice to round off the nearest 5Dhs.

Transportation

The local bus network in Dubai is quite good and links most areas, bus stops are air-conditioned with sliding doors.

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There is an efficient metro system that covers the city, check out special multi passes for longer stays. Taxis are a fast, efficient and a relatively cost friendly way to get around the city. "Abras", water taxis, are an interesting way to get across the creek, a pleasant few minutes with great scenery.



Did you know?

Dubai is the world's second largest distributor of bullion. It imports 360 tonnes and re-exports almostall of it.

Since 1833, Dubai has been ruled by the Al Maktoum dynasty.

Trade, real estate and financial services provide Dubai with the majority of its revenues.

Revenues from petroleum and natural gas contribute less than 6 percent to the economy of Dubai.

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Top tips

Best time to see Petra, especially for photo taking, is either early to mid-morning or late afternoon when the angled sun highlights and enhances the amazing natural colours of the rocks.

Dead Sea swimming... scratches and scrapes don't go well with heavily salted water, for the men, best you don't shave beforehand!

Transportation

Taxis are the recommended form of transportation, take a Yellow Taxi, negotiate the price or alternatively hire a car and driver for the day. Renting a car is very popular as distances are quite short in Jordan.

Amman A modern city that offers a fascinating mix of old and new. Ultra modern buildings meet the traditional coffee shops and small artisan workshops. Visit the galleries and museums, the Roman Theater, the citadel, there's so much to see and do, take a break and grab a meal at Hashem's, local food that will keep you going!

Petra "A rose-red city, half as old as time". Enter this ancient site through a narrow, 1km long gorge called the Siq and watch the wonders of Petra unfold before you, it has to be seen to be believed. A vast unique city carved into the sheer rock face nearly 2,000 years ago when it served as an important hub for the silk and spice trade routes, it is now, without a doubt, Jordan's most valuable treasure. Take your camera and comfortable shoes, it is one of the world's most special sites.

Wadi Rum A timeless place where weather and winds have carved spectacular vistas of towering cliffs, bold rock formations, canyons, ancient rock drawings and many more treasures. T.E. Lawrence (of Arabia) spent much time here and eloquently described it as "vast, echoing and Godlike...". Take the time to visit this unique marvel of nature, it will not disappoint. Hot air ballooning is also available.

Weather

Mediterranean climate with a hot and dry summer from May to October, July and August are the hottest, driest months with temperatures up to 36°C. Winter months between November and March. January is the coldest month and some areas experience snow.

Best times to go

Spring in April to May and autumn months, September to October.

The Dead Sea A float in this amazing sea is yet another of Jordan's many highlights for the visitor. At over 400m below sea level, the lowest point on earth, it is the saltiest, most mineral rich and unique body of water in the world. The unusually warm, buoyant waters have attracted visitors since ancient times, King Herod and Cleopatra have both enjoyed the rich, black stimulating mud. Try it for yourself, a wonderful and rejuvenating, effortless float in a warm sea of health giving minerals, absolute heaven! (Watch out for any cuts and scrapes before going in!)

Life changing experiences...

Downtown Beirut Located beside the port and marina this area is full of cafés, restaurants and places to shop, it's also home to many historical sites. The spiritual heart of this walking area is Place de L'Etoile, with the Lebanese parliament located nearby, fine examples of Lebanese Art Deco architecture. Beautifully reconstructed the city is truly a triumph of rejuvenation over disaster, wander the streets and enjoy the atmosphere.

Hamra, West Beirut A hive of activity and a shopaholic's paradise, plenty of shops and shopping malls, boutiques, large chain stores, hotels, restaurants, cafés, cinemas, bars and pubs. Walk around and explore Bliss Street, Hamra Street, Sourati Street and Jeanne d'Arc Street. A vibrant area of Beirut and well worth discovering.

The Corniche Take a walk along Beirut's famous Corniche and do a little people watching, from designer clad teenagers to 'tawla' playing gentleman and fishermen to street vendors it seems the whole of the city passes by at some point. Stop for a coffee along the way, watch the sunset and soak up the atmosphere on this special promenade.

Beirut's National Museum Located on Rue Damas, the former "Green Line" that split the factions during the civil war, the museum gives you a taste of recent history as well as a good look back across the centuries. Lebanon's rich heritage is on display here, with items from prehistoric settlements, Arab dynasties, the temples of Byblos, Egyptian style statues and Greek influenced artefacts from Roman Empires. A fascinating look at this unique country's history.

Ski Lebanon Only a short drive from Beirut the Lebanese mountains offer fabulous ski resorts with spectacular scenery and views, it's said that this is the only country in the world where one can ski on snow in the morning and swim in the Mediterranean in the afternoon! There are many resorts to choose from, Mzaar and Cedars being the most famous and plenty of après-ski activities too.

Ancient Lebanon Home to many impressive ancient sites, Lebanon has played a key role in the Middle East's long and fascinating history. Visit the temples of Baalbek, home to the most important Roman ruins in the Middle East and a highlight of any visit to Lebanon. Weather

Hot dry summers and cold wet winters. From June to August temperatures can be quite high, 30°C and coastal areas tend to be humid, the cooler mountains are a popular destination during the summer months. Winter in the mountains can be wet and cool with an average daytime temperature of 15°C.

Best time to go

Anytime is a good time to visit Lebanon, summer and winter offer different activities, spring and autumn are the best seasons weather-wise.

Tipping

Average tipping rate in restaurants is 10-15%, porters and taxi drivers appreciate a tip at your discretion.

Currency

Lebanese Pound, locally referred to as the lira, "LL".

Language

Arabic and French are the official languages, English is widely spoken.

Transportation

Bus transportation is a little limited in Beirut, there is a "hail and ride" system for a fixed fare. Taxis and "service" (shared taxis) are the most reliable and convenient way to get around the city and can be hired for trips outside of Beirut.

The first law school in the world was built in Lebanon.


