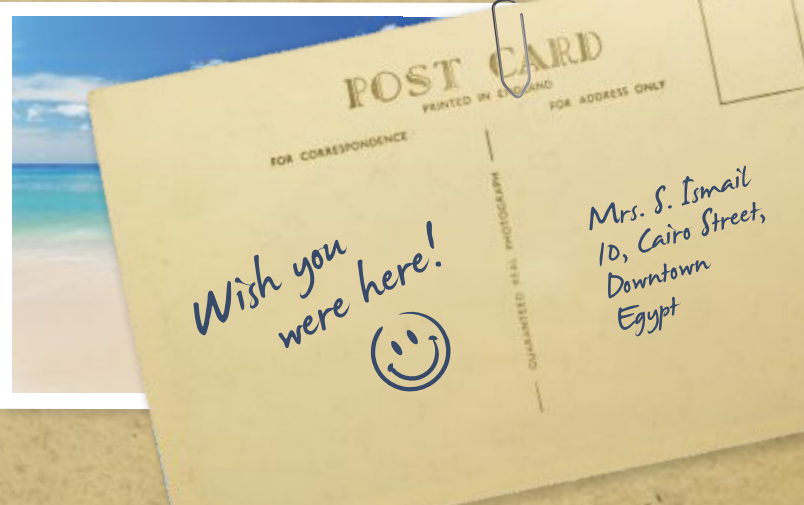

### Facts for the traveller...

#### Weather

Much the same throughout all the islands, 8 hours per day of sunshine and good weather nearly all year round. Average temperatures range from 21°C to 26°C. Rain and hurricane season is from June to November. High season from December to April.

#### Currency

Bahamian Dollar B\$, US\$ can be used anywhere.

#### Time zone

GMT -5 DST -4

#### Tipping

Most restaurants add 15% to the bill, check before tipping more. Taxis add 15%. Porters US\$1 per bag Housekeeping US\$2 per day.

#### Shopping hours

Mon to Sat:  
8.30am - 7.30pm.  
On Sundays some shops are open from 1pm to 6pm.

### Shopping hours

Mon to Sat: 9am - 5pm, some stay open longer.

Closed on Sundays and public holidays.

Restaurants open at 11am on weekdays and at noon on Saturdays.

### Transportation

There is no car rental in Bermuda as law does not permit travellers to drive there, mopeds and bicycles, however, are available to hire as the distances are quite small. Many simply walk around the areas they wish to see. Taxis are fine, if a bit expensive but best for getting to and from the airport. Buses are clean with air conditioning, ferries clean and efficient and can sometimes be the best option. A 'Bermuda Travel Pass' can be purchased and you can hop on or off both buses and ferries any time for 7 days, a very convenient way to get around.

**Wreck diving** Simply some of the best in the world. Bermuda's habit of swallowing ships has made diving here not only an unforgettable experience, but a lesson in history. ## Facts for the traveller...

### Weather

Famous for clear blue skies & warm sunshine. Summer 21°C to 30°C - high season, April to November. Winter can be a little cool for swimming but fine for other water sports, 15°C to 20°C, with the off season in December through March.

### Best time to go

Good all year round but the best time is April to November, the warmest months for all round activities.

### Currency

Bermuda Dollar, equal to the US\$ (also accepted)

### Language

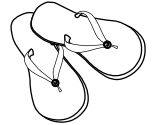
English, spoken here with a very different and interesting accent.

### Tipping

If not included in the bill, a 15% tip is generally expected at restaurants and hotels. Taxi drivers are usually tipped 10%. All Bermuda hotels add a hotel tax of 7.25% to the bill when you check out.

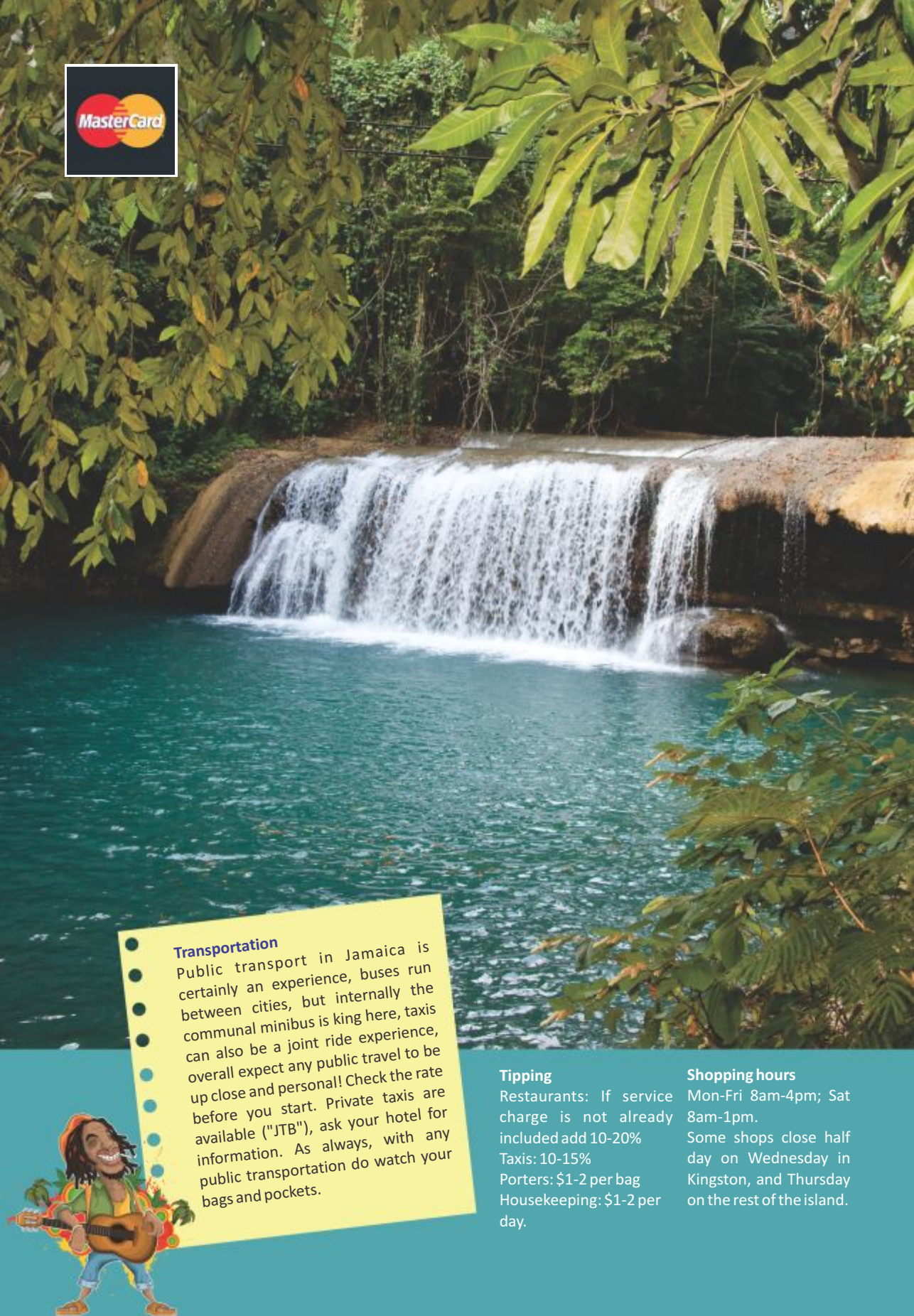

### Transportation

Public transport in Jamaica is certainly an experience, buses run between cities, but internally the communal minibus is king here, taxis can also be a joint ride experience, overall expect any public travel to be up close and personal! Check the rate before you start. Private taxis are available ("JTB"), ask your hotel for information. As always, with any public transportation do watch your bags and pockets.

### Tipping

Restaurants: If service charge is not already included add 10-20%  
Taxis: 10-15%  
Porters: \$1-2 per bag  
Housekeeping: \$1-2 per day.

### Shopping hours

Mon-Fri 8am-4pm; Sat 8am-1pm.  
Some shops close half day on Wednesday in Kingston, and Thursday on the rest of the island.

#### Weather

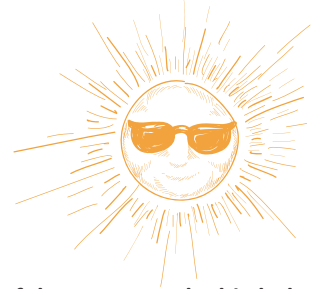
Average annual temperature between 25°C and 30°C, warm and sunny all year round. Hurricane season is between June & November.

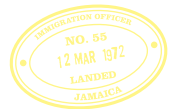
Although English is the country's official language, Jamaicans mainly speak to each other in Patois, which is a language made up of English and African Creole.

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### **Transportation**

Very economical public bus system in San Juan, schedule can be a little unpredictable so allow for time, service stops at around 9pm. Buses do not run between cities, privately owned minibuses do, your hotel can advise you. Taxis are available and run a simplified fare system in tourist areas.
