Public transport in Zagreb is a well developed tram and bus system, throughout other Croatian cities you will only find buses. Travel throughout the country is best served with buses, trains are available but can be limited and slow. Ferries serve the islands on the coast. Taxis are plentiful but they must be called or taken from a taxi stand, prices can be high and meters start at 25KN.

Tipping

Tipping in the cities is becoming common practice, tip 10-15% in restaurants if service charge has not been added, and round up the bill to the nearest Kuna in cafés. Taxi drivers do not expect a tip but it is appreciated.

Summers are hot and dry with average temperatures in August between 22 to 25°C, winters can be mild and wet along the Adriatic coast, with averages of 5 to 9°C. Winter temperatures in the interior regions are cold with temperatures as low as -2 to 0°C in January.

Diving, kayaking and fishing Clear turquoise waters, sunken ships, underwater caves and a rich marine life are just a few of the sights that dive enthusiasts can enjoy. For those who prefer to stay above the water sea kayaking and canoeing is an adventure not to be missed. For fishing enthusiasts from simple lines to big game fishing this is the place to be.

Istria This picturesque region of Croatia is the largest peninsula on the east coast of the Adriatic. Bus services cover the island and inner city transportation, buses run on weekdays from 7am to 6pm only and until 2pm on Saturdays with no service on Sundays, timetables are available but the schedule can be a little unreliable at times. Taxis can easily be found at hotels and on the street, using them for long distances however, can be expensive. Renting a car is an excellent and flexible way to tour the island, note that they drive on the left in Cyprus, it takes a little getting used to but is not too difficult.

Did you know?

One of the largest pots ever unearthed was near Limassol and is in the Louvre museum in Paris.

In autumn some 10,000 pink flamingos feed on the salt lake just outside of Larnaca on their migratory flight to warmer climes, a spectacular sight. King Richard the Lionheart celebrated his marriage in Limassol in the Middle Ages on his way to the Crusades.

The largest wild animal on the island is the rare Moufflon sheep found only on Cyprus, now very small in numbers but can be seen at Troodos.



Transportation

The Paris Metro and RER are convenient and easy public transport systems that cover the city and the outer suburbs. River travel is an alternative way of getting around parts of Paris, the convenient Batobus is a "hop on hop off" system that cruises the banks of the Seine. With all transport in Paris ask for passes if you staying for any length of time, it is a cheap and convenient way to use the many transport systems available. Taxis are available and metered, they can be expensive. Rail transport covers most of France and is an excellent way to travel.

The Eiffel Tower is painted every seven years.

The most visited attraction in Paris isn't the Eiffel Tower (5.5 million), or the Louvre (5 million), but Disneyland Paris at 13 million people per year.

Weather

Italy's weather can vary from north to south but spring begins officially on 21st March. April and May are extremely pleasant months, it gets hot from June until August, best to avoid the large cities at this time, the coastal areas can be pleasant during in summer. Boat travel is often used for coastal destinations and provides a pleasant change for the visitor. For long distances there are internal flights, and car hire is available.





Train services throughout Russia are adequate, but schedules can be unreliable, bus services are also not very reliable. Taxis can be found in many forms, some are just private cars, negotiate the price first, it is a strange system that does seem to work. Tipping

Tipping is not expected in Scandinavian countries, as a general rule round up the bill, for very good service add 10%, leave small change in cafés or bars. Also round up the bill with taxi services and be prepared to carry your own bags if you can!

Language

Although some Scandinavian languages are understood between the countries the main language used to communicate is English, visitors should have no problems speaking English in any of these countries.

Transportation

Copenhagen has a clean, efficient public transportation system spreading out past the city limits. Most transportation operates between 5am and 12.30-1am. Taxis are readily available in city centers, shopping areas and trains stations, or wave one down if required. Denmark has a reliable train system with reasonable fares and frequent services for travel throughout the country.

Norway has an extremely efficient public transport system and its trains, buses and ferries are often timed to link with each other. For inner city travel ask your hotel for info on the "Oslo Pass". Norway's excellent system of ferries connects the country's offshore islands to the mainland.

Sweden has a well organized bus and train service, with regional passes valid in local areas as well. Stockholm also runs an extensive metro system, day passes are cheaper and recommended. Avoid illegal taxis in Sweden, "Taxi Stockholm" or "Taxi Kurir" are recommended companies, others look like real taxis but are not and can charge a lot more, travellers beware! Public transport is well recommended and cheaper. **Finland** has a reliable train system. Helsinki runs buses, trams, ferries, local trains and a subway. The subway is small, consisting of one line and very simple to use. Buses and trains stop between 1 and 2am, Subway and trams stop at 11pm. Night buses area available on Weekends from 2am to 5am.

Iceland has good bus services covering Reykjavik, other towns and the country in general, 3 day passes are recommended. They run from 7 am to midnight on weekdays. Night buses run until 4 am on weekends, taxis are readily available, tipping is not necessary.



Spring and autumn temperatures are a cool 8 to 14°C. Temperatures can vary quite a bit depending on the altitude.





Weather round up

The UK has a temperate climate, with lows in the winter of up to -10°C and highs of up to 30°C in the summer. Although the UK is not large, the weather does differ slightly between the north, south, east and west. Scotland and Northern England tend to have slightly cooler temperatures and are quite likely to see some heavy snow in the winter months. In contrast, the south of England experiences warmer temperatures and is unlikely to see more than a few

flakes of snow in the winter. The west of England and Wales tends to see slightly higher rainfall than the east.

Tipping

A service charge of 12.5% to 15% may be added to your bill but the practice is not universal in UK restaurants. Don't be embarrassed to ask. If service is included, you are not expected to add anything further but you may want to add a small sum for particularly good service or extra attention. If service is not included, plan to leave a tip of 12 to 15%.

Transportation

The transportation system throughout the UK is modern and convenient. London's underground, the "Tube", is the fastest and most convenient way to get around the city, ask about the "Oyster Card" for longer stays and cheaper fares.

Air travel can be the quickest way to get where you're going in the UK; cheap flights are available to other popular British cities, worth checking out if time is an issue.

Car rental in the UK is a popular choice for those planning some independent sightseeing, an international driving license is required and note that driving is on the left.

Bus travel is an excellent choice for getting around the UK, it is particularly good if you are travelling between cities.

The UK rail system is extensive and convenient, intercity lines provide fast services between London and other major cities, rural areas are less well served. If travelling extensively by train "BritRail" offer a range of passes allowing for unlimited travel that could be worth considering.

Taxis are available in all cities throughout the UK, they are generally metered, extra is charged at weekends, public holidays and late at night.

Shopping hours

Most shops are open from 9 am to 5 or 6 pm. Some stay open later on a Friday. In smaller towns and villages half-day closing on Wednesdays and Saturdays is still practiced. Large shops and malls

are open on Sundays.
