

USA Weather

America is such a large, diverse country weather-wise, hard to cover state by state, but it is true to say that everyday there is somewhere in the United States that will have the perfect weather for your chosen holiday.

Summer and winter climates in the Northern Hemisphere are easy to define, however geographically the distances between regions in the States vary enormously and each area has its own special conditions and accordingly, things to do and see.

During the summer season, roughly May to September, beaches on the West Coast are popular destinations, whilst cities like New York can be uncomfortably hot, the desert areas are very hot and best left until cooler weather. The US offers a great winter season for snow lovers, roughly November through to April, with many states offering superior snow sport conditions.

Ideally adjust your holiday schedule to match the best time of year for your chosen US destination.

Time zones

The USA is divided into 4 time zones, with a three hour difference from the East to the West. Daylight saving begins in March and ends in November, Arizona is the only state that does not have DST. Alaska and Hawaii also have different time zones. **EST** Eastern Standard Time (Eastern Atlantic Coast states) GMT-3.

CST Central Standard Time (Great Plains, Gulf Coast & Mississippi Valley) GMT-4.

MST Mountain Standard Time (Roughly includes the Rock Mountain states) GMT-5.

PST Pacific Standard Time (The Pacific Coast states and Nevada) GMT-6.

AST Alaska Standard Time, GMT -7. **HST** Hawaii Standard Time GMT -9.

Tipping in the USA

Tipping can be a little confusing in the States, the following is a rough outline of tip procedures, it's worth noting that some cities have started added automatic "gratuity" on the bill, it's always a good idea to check it before you pay or tip.

Table Service Restaurants: Tip 15% of the bill, based on the quality of service. If you receive exceptional service, 15-25% is customary. In most major cities of the U.S. however, 20% is considered to be a "good tip".

Bar tips: Individual drinks you are served at a restaurant bar should always earn a \$1-2 tip each.

Hotel housekeeping: \$2-3 per night up to \$5, more in high-end hotels.

Concierge: Tipping is never expected, but always appreciated. The more difficult the request, the higher the tip. \$5.00 and up per request is good.




Porter: \$1-2 per bag.

Taxi Driver: 10-15% of fare, based on service.

Hotel limo driver: For a free ride from the airport, \$10 - \$20


